

All Saints' Day, changing of the clocks, election day, Thanksgiving, Black Friday, Christ the King, and Advent, oh my! November is a busy month! Even as the year is getting older, new things are waiting in the wings. The past, present, and future almost collide in these last days of the year.

With All Saint's Day we are given the opportunity to take a moment and reflect on those whom we have loved (past) and how they have impacted our lives and

our faith (present), we give thanks for them and that they have gone on to their reward (present *and* future). We are at the same time joyful and sorrowful. Then we will as a nation pause at Thanksgiving and remember with gratitude all the blessings that we have been showered with, even in the midst of trials. Christ the King is the last Sunday in the church year and it is a time to look forward to the day when Christ will again come and take his rightful place as Lord of heaven and earth. And then it's Advent already. We circle back to awaiting the birth of the King and his return.

Although we, and many other congregations, do not observe mid-week Advent activities, I hope that this will be a time of reflection, anticipation, and renewal in your life and in your life of faith. It is so hectic this time of year; darkness is not an unfamiliar image for us. The winter days are short, and the nights are long, the shopping is expensive, and the full calendar is exhausting! On top of all that, the world seems to have gone crazy and against all decency and against God. We also have our own personal darkness that seems to get even more intense as the winter and holiday season wears on. All this talk of joy to the world and peace on Earth seems to ring hollow for many of us who are not experiencing either of these. This makes the darkness even darker and the winter feel colder and more confining.

All of this is true AND...the Light is still shining in all the darkness in our world and in our own lives. Sometimes it appears very faint and very far away, but it is still there. Our present reality can be such that it is hard to make it out, but our eyes (and our hearts) are very good at seeking out light. The darkness cannot and has not and will never overcome the Light (see John 1:5). Thanks be to God!! The darkness will persist, and John the Evangelist knows this as well, *and* still there is Light. We can pass through a lot when we have a bright Light to lead us on the way. Light chases away the darkness; even the flicker of a single candle sheds light on a whole room. The past and present are what they are, and the future is still out there waiting to be explored. The light of Christ is always with us—past, present, and future—to help us to find joy and peace as we go.



## Web of Grace: Connected by our Faith, the Gospel, and our Response

With this as our **theme for Stewardship**, we will look at ways we can live out our response locally, in our country, and in our world through our giving in 2021.

Our local ministry initiative is **Mercy today Ministries**. Currently they provide 10,000 meals a year and 150-200 food boxes a month in the Fremont County area in addition to clothing and household articles. They have a bicycle ministry repairing and donating to individuals without transportation. SOTH initiative will support: 1)the bicycle ministry; 2)purchase of materials and painting their building so it is more easily identifiable to clients.

Our Web of Grace expands nationally to **St. Paul Lutheran Church** in Lake Charles, Louisiana whose sanctuary was destroyed by hurricanes Laura and Delta. Since 2007, Pastor Tim Norris has served the parish. The Sanctuary was destroyed but the fellowship hall is repairable and being use to distribute food and supplies. The parsonage was also damaged, but does have a new roof. Pastor Tim wishes to eliminate the \$8,000. owed Thrivent for the remaining mortgage in order to facilitate the building insurance claims. The insurance deductible is \$60,000. The current structure is being razed and the plan is to rebuild.

The Web of Grace is expanding to reconnect us with the church--Jesus de Los Milagros (Israel, Ixcan, Guatemala), celebrating 20 years in 2019. A delegation from SOTH visited them in 2002 and 2007. Contact has been reestablished with Igelsia Lutherana Augustina de Guatemala (ILAG) and Pastor Karen Castillo. Pastor Castillo thanks us for past support and informs us the church is growing in membership and has finally acquired title to the land for the church. They are now looking forward to building a "formal building". Pastor Ricardo remains as pastor at Israel She wonders if SOTH would be interested in participating in the building project!!!

The goal of our Web of Grace Appeal is to increase gifts and offerings by \$26,000. Pray for a generous response and please prayerfully consider increasing your gift for the coming year.

Consider 2 Corinthians 9:11-12. You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God. This service that you perform is not only supplying the needs of the Lord's people, but is also overflowing in many expressions of thanks to God.


